1. Identify inhibitors to adoption and resolve

- a. Convene state/regional/local workshops
- b. Survey for attitudes and disincentives
- c. Seek to solve operation and maintenance challenges

2. Improve practice tracking, reporting & verification

a. Standardize definition translation between states, NRCS, and Bay model

3. Target key practices and communities, and seek innovation

- a. Reduce dairy and beef nutrient overfeeding
- b. Exclusion buffers support riparian buffers goals
- c. Evaluate incentives for unique producers (ex. Amish and Mennonite communities)

4. Expand awareness and increase promotion activity

- a. Partner with important local organizations
- b. Flexible fencing options for flood prone areas (type and placement)

5. Plan and organize to achieve practice goals

- a. States develop specific plans for achieving LE goals by 2025
- b. Identify necessary funding and technical staff requirements
- c. Assess the status of livestock access to streams; know where you stand
- d. Evaluate the success of livestock exclusion to contribute towards achieving local water quality standards and protecting public health
- e. Evaluate the size and distribution of livestock operations to determine if targeting can achieve greater efficiency.
- f. Set a threshold of BMPs to qualify for land use taxation benefits. (Virginia Phase II WIP)
- g. Evaluate WIP top 5-7 agricultural BMPs to determine if implementation rates support WIP goals.
