





Best Management Practice (BMP) Verification

- Ensure continued operation and maintenance of implemented BMPs
 - On-site inspections/evaluations
 - Surveys self-reported, transect, remote sensing, etc.
 - Percentage of surveys completed required to have on-site evaluation
- Staff and Resource Intensive
 - Staff needed to follow-up on implemented BMPs
 - BMPs put in place due to permitting and/or other regulatory requirements that are not operated and maintained properly may lead to issues with non-compliance











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
