- Chartered by Congress in 1984
- Independent 501(c)(3) organization
- 30-member Board appointed by Sec. of the DOI
 - Includes FWS Dir. and NOAA Adm.

What We Do

- Sustain, restore and enhance the nation's fish, wildlife, plants and habitats for current and future generations
- Bring collaboration among federal agencies and private sector

NFWF SUPPORT FOR CHESAPEAKE BAY RESTORATION

Since 1999, NFWF has administered the **Chesapeake Bay Stewardship Fund**, drawing resources from federal and private sources to provide:

- Competitive grants that support on-the-ground restoration efforts (e.g. Innovative Nutrient and Sediment Reduction Grants, Small Watershed Grants, Pennsylvania Most Effective Basins Grants)
- Direct grant support for critical networking, information-sharing, and convening partnerships that accelerate watershed restoration efforts
- Contracted technical assistance support for prospective applicants and grantees to increase awareness, enhance impact, and guarantee success

NFWF SUPPORT FOR EXPANDED FEDERAL FUNDING, FY2022

In administering FY2022 BIL increases for EPA's INSR, SWG, and PA MEB programs:

- Directed focus on accelerated implementation of structural restoration practices that provide long-term water quality, habitat, and climate resilience benefits
- Demand and interest are high, esp. considering BIL match waivers, but still well beyond newly-available funding levels
- Significant interest and opportunity to advance restoration in partnership with historically underserved communities (consistent with BIL requirements)

NFWF SUPPORT FOR EXPANDED FEDERAL FUNDING, FY2023+

In talking with partners on best-use of future NFWF programs to leverage BIL and IRA funding for accelerated restoration, we hear critical needs for:

- Expanded and enhanced technical assistance (outreach, planning and design, permitting, financing → people) to unlock various available BIL and IRA funding pools
- Given existing programmatic restrictions, flexible, "program
 agnostic" funding that helps fill gaps in necessary project costs
- **Education and training** on associated programs and new opportunities and **novel partnerships** to best leverage individual programs for scaled on-the-ground project outcomes
