#### 1:45 P.M. WASTEWATER CHALLENGES: AGING SYSTEMS AND NEW DEVELOPMENT

Improved wastewater treatment using advanced technologies has reduced nitrogen loads to the Bay by millions of pounds annually. But many of the watershed's oldest and largest municipalities are facing deadlines to tackle ongoing sewer overflows from aging infrastructure. Moreover, continued growth in the region is putting pressure on utilities quickly approaching their permitted limits. What are the regulatory and legislative drivers pushing municipal wastewater treatment improvements? What funding sources and innovations are localities using to meet these challenges?
