DAWN vision is to develop the next generation of innovators by creating a talent pipeline that will cultivate and increase STEM-based talent from underrepresented populations.






Why: America Must Grow Talent to Solve Climate/Sustainability Issues

UDC Community to Career Partnership in Anacostia

UDC Community to Career Partnership in Anacostia is an innovative model to fast-track high school students to higher education and professional development.

- Early college high school model that allows students to earn professional certification or up to 60 transferable college credits towards an Associate Degree, while earning their high school diploma.
- Guiding students on a higher education path, taking professional certification or college courses as opposed to just preparing for college It helps make college "accessible" for low-income, urban learners.
- More than just earning credits or certificates, but opens the "college experience" to students and families

Anacostia Work Plan Goals

- Create a new generation of Environmental & Social Justice Leaders
- Reconnect citizens, starting with students, their caregivers and teachers to their waterways & parks in Anacostia
- Build a network of community and federal Partners
- Create a pipeline for students to get well-paying environmental justice & engineering internships and summer jobs
- Promote economic revitalization and prosperity through a Post-Secondary Partnership, including an Early College at Anacostia High School
- Encourage community involvement and stewardship through active partnerships, including the revitalization of the Anacostia Parent Teacher Organization
- Engage and hear the needs of the Anacostia community by hosting community meetings
- Measure results and evaluate factors to future success
