Commission members craft and secure passage of laws and policies that must balance many ecological, societal and economic concerns.

The restoration's primary focus is on clean water, believing that restored water quality will lead to improved conditions for the resources that depend upon it. "



Pennsylvania – 12.81 mil people

























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Legislative Process: Session Length

Maryland: 90 days

Virginia: 60 days (in even numbered years)

30 (45) days (in odd numbered years)

Pennsylvania: 2 years

Legislative Process: Bill is Introduced

Maryland: ~3,000 bills are introduced per session (Of the 3,127 bills introduced in 2018, 890 passed, or **28%**)

Bill is introduced/ sponsored

Pennsylvania: ~4,000 bills are introduced per session (Of the 4,021 bills introduced in 2017-18, 246 were enacted, or **6%**)

Virginia: ~3,000 bills are introduced per session (Of the 2,778 bills introduced in 2018, 919 passed, or **33%**)
