Environmental Investments, BMPs

- Manure storage (full year capacity)
- Compost stacking area
- Gravel cow walkways (with water diversions)
- · Pasture paddocks (rotational grazing)
- Manure transfer pump and holding tank
- Concrete barnyard
- Barnyard brown water collection
- Pumping and sprinkler system (barnyard)
- Milk house waste water to manure storage
- Silo leachate collection system
- Leak detection systems (running spring water)
- Roof spouting (keep clean water clean)
- Gravel field lane
